# Early Years Curriculum

## PRIME AND SPECIFIC AREAS

At NTIC, we use the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) which sets the standards that all early years providers must meet to ensure that children learn and develop well and are kept healthy and safe.

**Admission:** Here at NTIC, admission is given from ages 3 to 5.

Age 3 – Nursery 1

Age 4 – Nursery 2

Age 5 – Reception (end of EYFS)

**Our Educational Programmes:** This involves activities and experiences for children as set out under each of the areas of learning and the level of development children should be expected to have attained by the end of the EYFS and is defined by the early learning goals (ELGs) as set out below.

- ♦ **Communication and Language** (This involves the development of children's spoken language which are needed in all other areas of learning and development).  
ELG : Listening  
ELG : Attention

- ♦ **Personal Social and Emotional Development** (This is crucial for children to lead healthy and happy lives and is fundamental to their cognitive development).  
ELG : Self-regulation  
ELG : Managing self
- ♦ **Physical Development** (Physical activity is vital in children's all round development, enabling them to pursue happy, healthy and active lives).  
ELG : Gross motor skills  
ELG : Fine motor skills



- ♦ **Literacy** (It is crucial for children to develop a life-long love of reading).  
ELG : Comprehension  
ELG : World reading  
ELG : Writing
- ♦ **Mathematics** (Developing a strong grounding in number is essential so that all children develop the necessary building blocks to excel mathematically).  
ELG : Numbers  
ELG : Numerical patterns
- ♦ **Understanding the World** (This involves guiding children to make sense of their physical world and their community).  
ELG : Past and Present  
ELG : People culture and community  
ELG : The natural world
- ♦ **Expressive Arts and Designs** (This involves development of children's artistic and cultural awareness which supports their imagination and creativity).  
ELG : Creating with materials  
ELG : Being imaginative and expressive



## Our Curriculum-Primary

At NTIC Primary School, we run the Cambridge Curriculum for Mathematics, English, Science and Computer; while we operate Nigerian curriculum inclusive to cover subjects that can promote our national value.

The subjects covered under the Nigerian curriculum are: National Values, Religious Studies, Nigerian Languages and Moral Education.

In the quest to have total and complete child education, we designed co-curricular activities which have been infused into our teaching timetables; Music, Fine Art, PHE, Chess and Swimming. French is a foreign language that helps children to both be bi-lingual or multi-lingual and have better opportunities in their future choice of careers.



## EYFS Assessment

This plays an important part in helping parents, carers and practitioners to recognize children's progress, understand their needs and to plan activities and support.

This is done through observation. The observation of pupils is done on a daily basis and it is an incredibly powerful tool which help teachers to understand the pupils and their learning journey.

The report of the observation is usually sent home to the parents in order to know the level their kids have attained, the progress made and how to support.

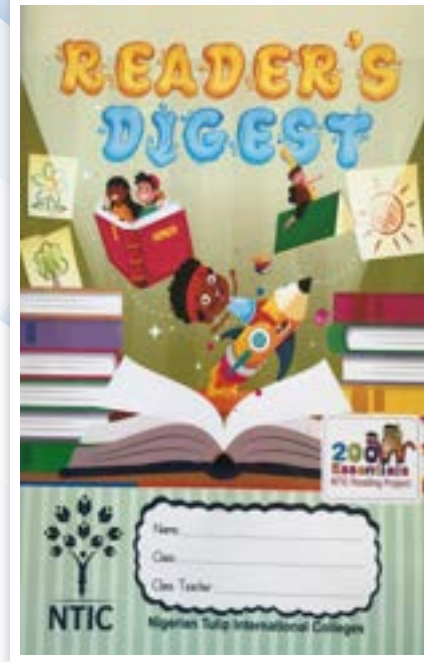
